Deputy Sally Carneiro's Corner

I have noticed over the past several weeks, an increase in parents parking in the parking lot in the mornings and walking their kids to the crosswalk. I have also witnessed parents trespassing by parking at Swiss Point Middle School and walking their children to Hickory Creek. Unfortunately, the same issue is happening in the afternoons. I understand morning drop off is quite busy, with close to 200 new students this year, however for the safety of all our children I am requesting parents

follow the policy listed in the Hickory Creek Student Handbook. Please join the parent drop-off line and drop your children off with the safety patrol students. Crossing children at the crosswalk in the mornings additionally holds up traffic for vehicles exiting the school. Ms. Gonzalez has spoken to the Sheriff's Office Public Safety Assistant (PSA) supervisor to notify him of traffic build up in the mornings. Please be patient as they are training new PSA's in this area. It will not take long for traffic to begin to flow at a better rate.

For the issue of students arriving to school late (after 8:25am), I would suggest arriving to school closer to 8am when there is very little traffic. If your student is dropped off after 8:25am, you are required to park and walk your student into the front office and sign them in. It is not safe to send your student inside without your supervision. If you are wondering if you live in zone for your student to catch our school bus, please call Transportation at 904-547-7810.

Due to the recent "Parents' Bill of Rights", F. S. 1014.06 –
Parental Consent for Health Care Services, parents must give written consent in order for their child to access health care while at school. If you have not done so yet, please complete the Parent Consent for Health Care Services Form now or read an FAQ about this new legislation.

UPDATED COVID-19 Information

As we see an increase in COVID19 cases in our community, please review the SJCSD protocols found at https://www.stjohns.k12.fl.us/covid-19/. In addition, please take time to review the Student Health Screening Entry Form. Should your child have any of the symptoms listed, please consider keeping them home. We may see an increase in mask use, while not mandated, it is an option for our families and staff. We will respect each other's choice. If you are interested in desk shields for your child, please contact your child's teacher directly.

On 9/22/2021, the Department of Health updated their emergency rule (64DER21-15) to include instruction student quarantines.

- 1. Student quarantines: (3)(a) Parents or legal guardians of students who are known to have been in direct contact with an individual who received a positive diagnostic test for COVID-19 may choose one of the following options:
 - a. 1. Allow the student to attend school, school-sponsored activities, or be on school property, without restrictions or disparate treatment, so long as the student remains asymptomatic; or
 - b. 2. Quarantine the student for a period of time not to exceed seven days from the date of last direct contact with an individual that is positive for COVID-19.

With the increase in COVID-19 numbers and need to make sure we are timely with our communication, we are asking parents to use an online form to report a positive student and we will adjust how we communicate with you regarding a positive COVID-19 case on campus.

To notify us of your child's positive COVID-19 test result we are requesting that you complete the Optional Positive Student Reporting Form. However, should you feel you need to discuss your child's COVID-19 scenario in detail, please feel free to bypass the form and call the District COVID Support Team at 904-547-8230.

When we receive information regarding a positive student, we will communicate to <u>all</u> parents in the classroom that there has been a positive case in your child's class. In the past, we have only communicated to close contacts. By making this adjustment, we can notify parents faster and more efficiently.

Absences


A <u>written note</u> is needed within 48 hours of returning to school stating the cause of the absence.
